

# Breakthrough in Burma

In the long struggle for Burmese independence from British rule, Dr. Ba Maw was the key figure, the man who developed the ideology, planned and implemented the campaign, and molded disparate groups into an effective political force. These memoirs not only give us an inside view of the revolution he led but provide the most complete account of Burma's role in World War II. # ASIAN POLITICAL SYSTEMS: Readings on China, Japan, India and Pakistan

These selected readings are for undergraduate and graduate students of Asian politics and comparative politics in general. Each country is treated separately, but there is a common analytical framework which includes political culture, leaders and ideologies, political parties, political institutions, and political processes. A unique feature is that the selections are drawn exclusively from writers native to each country and topics are covered by authors examining their own political processes rather than by Western writers analyzing an alien culture.

#### THE ESSENCE OF CHINESE CIVILIZATION

This volume of translations spans the broad perspective of the Chinese cultural system for a period of 3,000 years.
