#### THE SEVENTH ANNUAL MEETING, 1978

The Seventh Annual Meeting was held in London on 4, 5 and 6 July 1978. The earlier part of the proceedings was under the Presidency of Professor W. LINFORD REES, and following the Business Meeting on 5 July Professor Desmond Pond was inducted as President.

#### Scientific Meetings

The meetings on Tuesday 4 July were held at the Institute of Psychiatry.

Little; 'The effect of anticonvulsant drugs on behaviour', Dr Michael Trimble; and *Bereavement:* 'Bereavement and sudden unexpected death in infancy (Sudden infant death syndrome)', Dr Kerry Bluglass; 'Psychotherapy of the dying patient', Dr Averil Stedeford; 'Befriending in widowhood—an evaluation of efficiency', Dr T. L. Dunn.
