V. THE PUBLICATIONS OF THE INTERNATIONAL ASTRONOMICAL UNION

Introduction

The following is a list of publications that have been published by, or directly for, the IAU, or sponsored in some way by the Union (with or without the aid of an IAU grant towards the cost of printing); no attempt has been made to separate the publications according to the various degrees of IAU sponsorship. This list does not represent a formal and comprehensive bibliography of literature published or sponsored by the IAU, but is intended only to assist Members of the Union, and others, in obtaining IAU publications as easily as possible, and to serve as a general guide to the principal publications supported in some way by the Union. Some of the information included is for record only, as certain publications are now out of print, especially the earlier volumes of the Transactions.

Full particulars regarding prices, method of ordering, etc., are not available in all cases. Indications given in brackets are intended for Members of the Union; for example (M: \$3.50. Orders to the Assistant Secretary) indicates that Members may secure the volume on application to the IAU Assistant Secretary at the price of \$3.50. All applications to the Assistant Secretary should be addressed as follows:
