Formally established in September 1968, the Conference Group on German Politics is composed of political scientists, sociologists, contemporary historians, and economists who devote a major portion of their work to the study of contemporary German affairs, both in West and East Germany. Its purposes are to promote communication among American scholars, to publicize, encourage, and plan research efforts and to develop systematic contacts with German academicians. Chairman of the Group is Professor George K. Romoser, Department of Political Science, University of New Hampshire, Durham, New Hampshire 03824. The first major undertaking of the Group will be a two-day conference on "The West German Polity, 1969," to be held in Bad Godesberg June 27–28, 1969, with participation of American and West German scholars and West German political leaders.
