# PAULSEN PROGRAMME

After a pause because of the pandemic the Paulsen Programme's fellowship programme for citizens of the Russian Federation is restarting from 1 January 2022 in expanded form.

# INTERNATIONAL FELLOWSHIPS

Applications are invited for 1-3 month fellowships for early- and mid-career historians who need to conduct research in archives and libraries outside the Russian Federation. The fellowships are primarily available for historians working on the period from the mid-seventeenth century down to 1918, for research on Russian history or other historical topics. Candidates must be citizens of the Russian Federation based in the Federation. Applicants must present a statement on their proposed research, a cv and list of publications, and a letter of support from a senior academic historian who knows their research.

# **PROVINCIAL FELLOWSHIPS**

A new fellowship scheme aimed at early- and mid-career historians working in the provinces of the Russian Federation who need to conduct research in the archives and libraries of St Petersburg and Moscow. Fellowships will be held for 1-3 months and the application process is the same as for international fellowships.
