Chemotherapy in Acute Otitis Media

EVERY case of uncomplicated acute suppurative otitis media should be treated by sulphonamide therapy in accordance with the fundamental principles of high initial dosage and regular frequent administration. In this way the incidence of mastoiditis may be reduced to a low figure. When a bacteriological diagnosis has not been made DAGENAN—M & B 693 should be used as a proportion of cases are pneumococcal, but in known haemolytic streptococcal cases sulphanilamide (May &

Baker) orally or PROSEPTASINE orally in association with parenteral SOLUSEPTASINE may be employed. In the comparatively rare Staphylococcus aureus otitis media THIAZAMIDE may be substituted.

While cases of acute mastoiditis may frequently be prevented or aborted, chemotherapy is also of value as an adjuvant to surgical intervention in established mastoiditis for the treatment or prevention of complications, especially otogenic meningitis.

CLINICAL INSTRUCTION

Clinical instruction in the Diagnosis and Treatment of Diseases of the Ear, Nose and Throat is given in the Out-patient Department from 2 to 5 p.m. daily, and on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6 to 9 p.m. also. Major operations are performed every morning and afternoon, except Saturdays, in the In-patient Operating Theatres. Minor Operations are performed in the Out-patient Operating Theatre on three mornings a week.




