Call for Papers, CPSA 1981 Annual Meeting

Members of the Association are invited to submit proposals for papers to be presented at the Annual Meeting of the Canadian Political Science Association to be held at Dalhousie University, Halifax, Nova Scotia, May 27, 28, and 29, 1981.

A proposal should include: (a) a title; (b) a summary (about 300 words) of the argument of the paper; and (c) a description of the method of analysis.

Proposals may be submitted to any member of the Programme Committee listed below. The deadline for submission of proposals is November 3, 1980.

Completed papers should be not more than 30 pages in length, double-spaced and should not have been previously published.

The Programme Committee invites suggestions concerning topics for panels and plenary sessions as well as proposals for papers.

Papergivers are required to provide the CPSA secretariat with two copies of their paper by May 1 and be prepared to provide up to 100 copies for dissemination within the community.
