THE BRITISH SOCIETY FOR PARASITOLOGY

The British Society for Parasitology was formed on 4th April 1962 to replace the Parasitology Group (Institute of Biology), which had been in existence for five years.

The objects of the Society are to advance the study of Parasitology and to promote the wider dissemination of recent advances in this subject, by facilitating intercourse and discussion amongst those interested in all branches of Parasitology, whether they are protozoologists, helminthologists, plant nematologists or entomologists.

The present policy of the Society is to hold two scientific meetings each year, a Spring Meeting (usually outside London) at which 20-30 contributed papers are read, and an Autumn Meeting (usually in London) at which a few specialists are invited to give rather longer papers on their own subjects.
