This pioneering research aid places over 31,000 works on traditional, Republican, and Communist China in all languages within a single frame of reference. Prepared specifically for social scientists and institutional historians, the volumes provide both retrospective and current bibliographic control of the secondary literature on Chinese society, the Chinese economy and polity, and personality and culture in China from the beginning of the Ch'ing dynasty to the present. Each entry is coded as to topic, time period, geographic region, type of local or regional system to which the work refers (village, market town, city-centered system, etc.), and the kinds of research on which it is based. In all volumes, headings are in English, Chinese, and Japanese. Chinese and Japanese publications are cited in characters as well as romanization, and all non-English titles are given an English rendering. Cross-tabulating the codes for all entries, computer programs have prepared a subject index by historical period, a subject index by geographical area, and a local-systems index. In addition to the three analytical indexes that are this bibliography's most distinctive feature, conventional author and subject indexes are included.






