REPORT

THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING TOOK PLACE ON THURSDAY, 7TH NOVEMBER, 1946, AT THE GUILDHALL SCHOOL OF MUSIC, JOHN CARPENTER STREET, E.C.4.

THE PRESIDENT IN THE CHAIR.

1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on 13th November, 1945, having been read and confirmed, the Secretary read the

2. Report of the Council.

The Council has pleasure in presenting the Report of the seventy-second session, during which the following seven papers were read: (1) "The Cognitive Element in Musical Response," by Dr. H. Lowery; (2) "The Influence of the Industrial Revolution on English Music," by Reginald Nettel; (3) "Opinions and Prognostications (extracted from the Proceedings of the Royal Musical Association)," by Mr. K. Ernest Irving; (4) "The Development of the Traditional Hand-made Pipe (an account of the Pipers' Guild)," by Miss Margaret James; (5) "The Treatment of Ground," by Dr. Greenhouse Allt, with illustrations by Dr. Lloyd Webber and students of the Trinity College of Music; (6) "The Musical Glasses and Glass Harmonica," by Mr. Hyatt King; and (7) "Some Aspects of Song Interpretation," by Miss Dorothea Webb, with illustrations by the Lecturer, Miss Margaret Emmerton and Miss Mona Rees. The Council desires most cordially to thank all the above for their valuable contributions.

Seven meetings were held during the session, four at the Trinity College of Music and three at the Guildhall School of Music.

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The Council regrets to record the death of Sir Hugh Allen, Canon F. W. Galpin, Dr. Thomas Dunhill, Sir Edward Bairstow, Sir James Jeans, the Rev. Sydenham Holmes and Mr. Royle Shore. Canon Galpin joined the Association in 1900 and read four papers during his long membership. He occupied the Presidential Chair from 1938 to 1942. Sir Hugh Allen became a member in 1908. He read a paper in 1909 and was President from 1921 to 1924. Dr. Dunhill joined in 1918 and served on the Council from 1925 to 1938. He was an Honorary Auditor from 1943. Sir James Jeans, who became a Life Member in 1938 found time during a distinguished career in science to take both a theoretical and practical interest in music.

During the session the losses in membership were twelve while thirty new members were elected. The number of members on June 30th was Hon. Foreign 5, Life Members 55 and Subscribing Members 223, making a grand total of 283.

Meetings of Council were held on October 8th at the Royal Academy of Music; on February 12th at the Guildhall School of Music and on March 12th at the Trinity College.

The Audited Accounts showed a balance in hand on September 30th of £255 14s. od.

The Report was adopted on a motion from Mr. Lawrence, seconded by Mr. Tobin.

- 3. The Honorary Treasurer presented the audited Accounts which were passed on a motion from Mr. Tobin, seconded by Mr. Oldman. Mr. Tobin coupled with his proposition a vote of thanks to the Honorary Treasurer for his valuable services and to Mr. Austin for his auditing of the accounts.
- 4. In accordance with the Articles the President, the Vice-Presidents, the Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Auditor retired and were eligible for re-election. The list of Council nominations to fill these offices was the same as last year with the addition of Dr. Vaughan Williams and Professor Westrup who had been nominated as Vice-Presidents. As the Secretary had received no other nominations the Chairman declared those named to be duly elected.

The five ordinary members of Council retiring this session in accordance with Article 6 (a) were Captain Broadwood, Mr. Howes, Mr. Lawrence, Sir James Swinburne and Professor Westrup. Professor Westrup had

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already been nominated as a Vice-President. The Secretary had received the following six nominations: Captain Broadwood, Mr. Howes, Mr. Lawrence and Sir James Swinburne nominated by the Council, Mr. Anthony Lewis, nominated by Mr. Abraham and the Secretary, and the Rev. T. H. Croxhall, nominated by Mr. Lloyd and Mr. Levien. As the result of a ballot Mr. Lewis, Mr. Lawrence, Mr. Howes, Captain Broadwood and Sir James Swinburne were elected.

- 5. Miss Marion Scott moved a vote of thanks to the President, for his services during the past four years. He had been elected at a critical time in the progress of the war. Yet, during his tenure of office the Association had prospered, the membership had steadily grown and the high quality of the papers read had been fully maintained. Mr. Lloyd seconded this motion.
- 6. The meeting closed with votes of thanks to the Trinity College of Music and to the Guildhall School of Music for their kind hospitality during the past session moved from the Chair.
