### Wellcome Bibliography for the History of Medicine

As a result of changes within the Wellcome Library, the *Wellcome bibliography for the history of medicine* (formerly known as *Current work in the history of medicine*) has ceased to be produced from June 2004. Citations created for it will still be searchable as part of the

catalogue of the Wellcome Library for the History and Understanding of Medicine (http://catalogue.wellcome.ac.uk). The *Bibliography* has served the international history of medicine community loyally for the past fifty years, but technology and events have now overtaken it.

### Bakken Fellowships and Grants 2005

Each year, the Bakken Library and Museum in Minneapolis offers Visiting Research Fellowships and Research Travel Grants to facilitate research in its collections. Visiting Research Fellowships up to a maximum of \$1,500 are to be used to help to defray the expenses of travel, subsistence, and other direct costs of conducting research at The Bakken. The minimum period of residence is two weeks. Preference is given to researchers who are interested in collaborating with The Bakken on exhibits or other programmes. The next deadline is 18 February 2005.

Travel Grants up to a maximum of \$500 (domestic) and \$750 (foreign) are to be used to help to defray the expenses of travel, subsistence, and other direct costs of conducting research at The Bakken. The minimum period of residence is one week. Application may be made any time during the calendar year.
