### VOLUME TWO THE KUWAIT CRISIS: SANCTIONS AND THEIR ECONOMIC CONSEQUENCES

This volume contains an extended collection of legislation adopted by States, both Members and non-Members of the UN, implementing the Security Council sanctions resolutions directed against Iraq.

Reproduced here are the texts of the principal legislation, subordinate legislation, notices and orders adopted in more than 120 jurisdictions. In a number of cases, foreign language texts are accompanied by translations into English. The volume reproduces a number of letters to the UN Secretary-General from Members summarising the manner in which they are fulfilling the sanctions requirements. Also included are reports of the UN Secretary-General to the UN Sanctions Committee.

The volume also contains letters from a number of UN Members on the application of Article 50 of the UN Charter dealing with the solution of the special economic problems confronting them as a result of the enforcement measures taken against Iraq, together with reports of the special Security Council Committee charged with dealing with these problems.

The volume concludes with analyses of the economic aspects of the problem by the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund.
