The journal is devoted to the art and techniques of applying mathematics and the development of new applicable mathematical theories. It contains papers on the different aspects of the relation between theory and application: descriptive papers on actual applications, papers on technique and method when applying existing mathematical tools (e.g. in working examples), and of special importance, papers on mathematics motivated by the prospect of potential application, and on those established parts of mathematics which seem to be on the threshold of application.

In particular, the editors hope to create a forum through which mathematicians and other scientists can be introduced to new techniques of applying mathematics and/or to new fields of application. This is achieved via the medium of longer survey, review and state-of-the-art papers which are written with a large and varied academic audience in mind. Mathematics is applicable to a truly imposing range of problems in a wide variety of fields, often in surprising ways, and this journal aims to contribute significantly to establishing and communicating this applicability.

Periodically special issues will be devoted to particular fields of application, often under the guidance of a guest editor.

EDITORIAL POLICY

The BULLETIN of the Australian Mathematical Society aims at quick publication of original research in all branches of mathematics. The Editors receive more than twice as much material as can be published in the BULLETIN; many meritorious papers can, therefore, not be accepted. Manuscripts must be in their final, publishable form when submitted and papers which appear to need revision are unacceptable. We prefer clear and full arguments, and especially clear and full motivation, to mathematical telegrams. Make the style attractive and avoid ugly abbreviations. Manuscripts are accepted for review with the understanding that the same work is not concurrently submitted elsewhere.

Authors are asked to avoid, as far as possible, the use of mathematical symbols in the title. Arrange references alphabetically (by surname of the first author), and ensure their accuracy: author's names should appear as in the work quoted; and if this has not appeared yet or is not readily accessible to everybody (for example, a preprint), a photocopy of the title page of the copy you have used will be of great help to us.

AUTHORS' ABSTRACTS

- 1. Each paper must include an abstract of not more than 200 words.
- In writing abstracts, authors should bear in mind that these may be the only parts of the papers that are read.
- The abstract should contain a brief but informative summary of the contents of the paper, but no inessential details.
- 4. The abstract should be self-contained, but may refer to the title.
- The abstract should be written in completely connected sentences, not as a list of headings. Abbreviations should be avoided.
- The abstract should be non-technical, and intelligible without reference to the full paper. Specific references (by number) to a section, proposition, equation, bibliographical item should be avoided.

SUBJECT CLASSIFICATION

Authors should include in their papers one or more classification numbers, following the 1980 Mathematics Subject Classification (1985 Revision). Details of this scheme can be found in each Annual Index of Mathematical Reviews.

ELECTRONIC MANUSCRIPTS

In future the Bulletin will be produced using AMS—TEX. Authors who are able to do so are invited to prepare their manuscripts using TEX. Hard copy only should be submitted for assessment, but if the paper is accepted the author will be asked to send the text on a 5¼ inch IBM PC compatible flexible diskette. [Typed manuscripts will, of course, still be acceptable.]
