Editors' Note

Manuscripts may now be submitted in the third biennial competition for the Edwin Gay Memorial Prize in economic history, it has been announced by the sponsoring Economic History Association. The deadline for receipt of manuscripts is July 1, 1966.

Open to any American or Canadian scholar, the competition seeks the most intrinsically scholarly unpublished papers (not exceeding 150,-000 words) whose breadth and scope of inquiry and insight open up new areas of scholarship or analytically explore major changes and developments in economic processes and institutions.

A prize of \$1,500 is offered, together with payment of costs which may be required to assure publication of the chosen manuscript. Funds are contributed by the Council on Research in Economic History.

Entries should be submitted in duplicate, unsigned and containing no statement of authorship but accompanied by a sealed and signed letter which may be removed before the manuscript is turned over to the judges, and addressed to:

The panel of judges will be announced in a later issue of the Journal.
