





Published since 1951 by the International Political Science Association (all back volumes are available), the *Abstracts* is a major source of bibliographic information in political science. It publishes abstracts of articles in specialized and non specialized periodicals, including major yearbooks. Articles in English are abstracted in English; those in other languages (about one fifth of the total) are abstracted in French, with all titles translated into English. In 1999 it published 7.434 abstracts from nearly 1,000 journals, in six issues. Each issue carries a **detailed subject index** (cumulative for all previous issues of the same year) and a list of the periodicals examined. The final issue of each volume also provides an **author index**.
