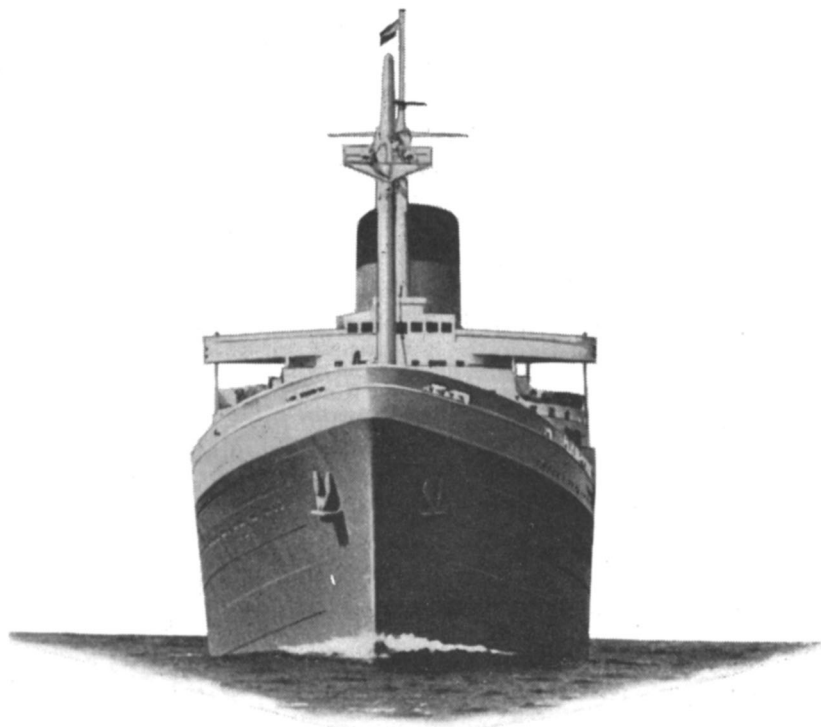

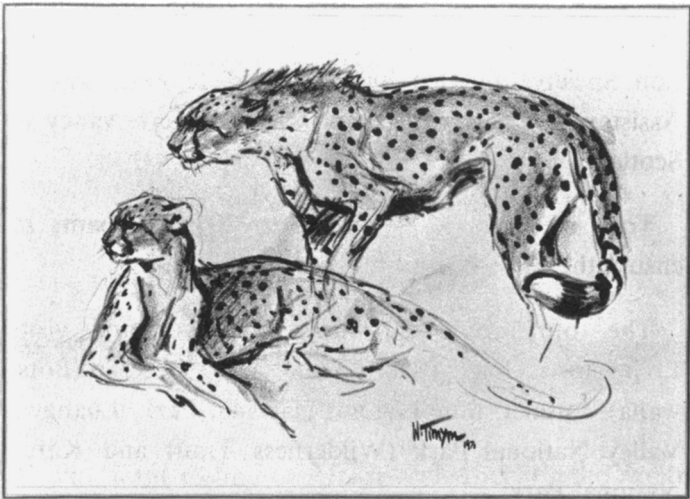

The British Schools Exploring Society



In its 40th year, this well established educational Charity founded by the late Surgeon Commander G. Murray Levick has maintained a high tradition of giving young men between the ages of 16½–19½ an unique opportunity inspired by the founder's own experiences during Captain Scott's Antarctic Expedition of 1910–1912.

The annual 7 week expeditions to Arctic Regions of Scandinavia and Finland, Iceland, Northern Canada, Greenland and Spitsbergen include upwards of 70 young men under the guidance of an administrative Chief Leader and led in studies of the environment by acknowledged experts in the physical and life sciences.

Not least among the objectives is to encourage the participants in displaying and enhancing as yet untried qualities of leadership and initiative and the maintenance of physical and mental fitness while contending with problems of terrain and weather encountered in wild, trackless and mountainous regions, under canvas.

The Society welcomes applications from any young men within the age limits. All will be interviewed by the Selection Committee, subject to recommendations by headmasters or employers sponsoring apprentices, cadets, articled clerks etc. etc.

The Society also welcomes applicants, who have specialised qualifications to lead parties of 10 young men in the study of physical and life sciences and in the practice of survey, under the overall authority of the Chief Leader. Age limits are 24–40—physical fitness being of great importance.

Readers of *Oryx* will appreciate that rising costs of travel and equipment have to be faced. On average each participant must find £180 from his own resources, by grant or sponsorship. The Society seeks to control the overall costs by accepting donations gratefully or by subscriptions from Associate members, who recognise the value of this service to the community, which is patronised by many of the household names in Polar Exploration, under the Patron-in-Chief Prince William of Gloucester.

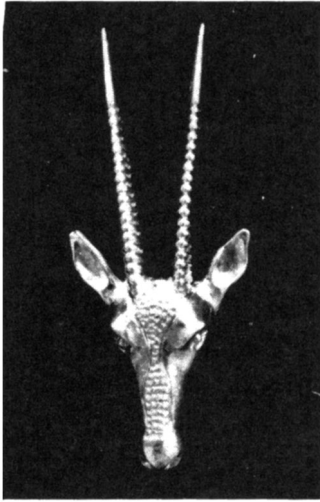

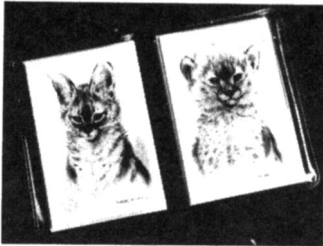
